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he Union government's idea to suspend trading in scrips of public sector undertakings (PSUs) on their divestment day has not gone down well with market players. who feel the proposal is unfair and would put existing investors in a spot.

The department of disinvestment (DoD) has sent a proposal to the markets regulator. Securities and Exchange Board of India, to suspend trading in a stock on the day of its share sale. by the government. The Centre has set a disinvesment target of t69,000 crore for 2015-16.
